Serve your community and share your input regarding economic development, parks, or planning and zoning by becoming a member of one of the City's Advisory Commissions. Applications are being accepted until Tuesday, January 15 for the Economic Development Authority (EDA), Park Commission, and Planning Commission. Below is a quick overview of each one.

EDA: The EDA seeks to promote economic growth by creating partnerships, fostering employment opportunities, supporting diverse housing programs, and expanding the tax base through development and redevelopment. The EDA meets on the second Monday of the month at 5:30 pm.

Parks: The Park Commission provides recommendations to the City Council and City Staff on developing, improving, and maintaining all city parks. The Park Commission meets on the third Monday of the month at 5:30 p.m.

Planning: The Planning Commission prepares and reviews the City's comprehensive plan, adopts official controls to implements the City's plan, and reviews and make recommendations on all development applications.

Northside Park Renamed Veterans Memorial Park for Future Park Improvements

Northside Park has been officially renamed Veterans Memorial Park. The name of the baseball field will remain Don Timpe field. The City Council voted to change the name at their November meeting to correspond with a park improvement project currently being explored which is proposed to include a Veterans Memorial.

The project has not increased taxes to any property in the City and will not increase taxes in the future. The City of Maple Plain prides itself on being fiscally responsible with tax payer money and will fund the project through Park Capital funds and Park dedication fees that are accumulated through land developments in the City. Additionally, the Orono Rotary has raised and donated to the City \$9,000

through their first Party in the Park event. The 2019 Party in the Park event is scheduled for June 1, 2019.

Preliminary concept drawings have been drafted for feedback and consideration. To the right is an overview of a potential future site plan.

New/improved features include in the preliminary concept drawing include:

- Veterans Memorial and Plaza
- Bandshell and open lawn area (on the location of the former BMX track)
- An additional picnic shelter with serving counters
- Electricity throughout the park including in both picnic shelters
- Looped walking path
- New playground equipment
- Space dedicated for possible future movement of Maple Plain Historical Museum and Library
- Paved and striped parking lots

City Staff will be bringing back more detailed plans and estimated costs to the January 28, 2019 City Council Meeting. At this meeting City Council will be providing City Staff direction on preparing a bid package- whether to prepare a bid package and if so what to include in it. The improvements may occur in phases with work potentially beginning as early as this spring.




Heart Safe AED Training – February 12th



Maple Plain has decreased tax levy for second year in a row.







The City's final property tax levy as well as the General Fund budget for 2019 was approved by the City Council on Monday, December 17, 2018. The City is proud to share that for the second year in a row, the City's property tax levy has decreased. This means that as a whole Maple Plain property owners will again be paying less to the City in property taxes! Please note that your City property tax is only a portion of your property tax, other portions such as Orono School District property taxes and Hennepin County property taxes are also included.

West Hennepin Public Safety announces the 2019 Citizens Police Academy

West Hennepin Public Safety has announced the dates for the 2019 Citizens Police Academy. The Citizens Police Academy will start on February 14, 2019 and will end with graduation on April 4, 2019. The Academy runs for eight weeks, one day a week, Thursday nights, from 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 pm.

WHAT IS IT?

The Citizens Academy is a FREE 24-hour block of instruction designed to give citizens knowledge about how your police department operates, our policies, procedures, programs and challenges. In addition, you will be introduced to government officials and staff and learn about the responsibilities of their

respective office. Participants in each session will commit to meeting 3 hours, one night a week for 8 weeks.

The Citizens Police Academy was designed to create a better understanding of law enforcement through education. The Citizens Police Academy participants are presented with realistic hands on information, which will help each participant better understand the police department functions. The classroom and hands on information covers: DWI and Traffic Enforcement, home security, personal security, use of force, including deadly force which includes a demonstration of the Taser Gun and FATS training (firearms simulation), Hennepin County Dispatch Center, Court procedures including testifying before a Judge and many other areas related to law

This is a great opportunity to meet your police officers, fellow citizens, and other members of government to learn why we do what we do. At graduation you will receive a certificate and become a member of the Citizens Academy Network Alumni.

We believe an informed citizenry will enhance public safety, make better decisions about how to protect themselves and their business, understand law enforcement strategies to problemsolving and provide leadership to other areas of government.

This class is a must for those people who live or work in or near the West Hennepin Public Safety Department's jurisdiction. The West Hennepin Public Safety Department is currently establishing a list of participants who would be interested in the next class. The recommended attendee age is 18 years and older. Thank you to the State Tournament and National Tournament teams that gave us reasons to celebrate your success.


Thank you to our cities we serve for equipping our department to do and be the best we can be.
